Village Plan

In the New Year, your Parish Council is going to start the process of completing a Village Plan. This will seek to guide the development of the village over the next 10 -15 years as well as tackle

priority issues. The start of this process is the completion of a questionnaire which is distributed to all households in the village. We will be aiming for a 100% return and then will use the information we gather to plan for the future. The questionnaire will be delivered in the first week of January and there will be a two-week turn around. Your questionnaire will be delivered and collected by a Parish Councillor. We aim to report back the main points at an open village meeting in March or April. I look forward to reading and analysing your views.

Ganges update

As far as we know, the Section 106 agreements between the developers, Haylink and Babergh District Council still have not been signed, but we are chasing it. We have had confirmation that the signing has not yet been completed. We were told at the last Parish Council meeting (11.11.15), by District Councillor Derek Davis, this will happen shortly and is only held up on the smallest detail. Proposed changes to the Fire service. Consultation open until 22nd Feb

Suffolk County Council is reviewing the provision for our Fire Service. They propose to cut the number of fire engines and firefighters at Ipswich and, maybe, remove the auxiliary fire station at Holbrook. This directly affects us. Their plans are out for consultation until 22nd Feb. At our recent Parish Council meeting David Woods, Tattingstone resident, Suffolk County Councillor and exfirefighter, asked us to take part in the consultation. David Woods view is clear: "I think these [proposals] are going far too far. We are not only cutting to the bone, we are cutting through the bone".
