I was walking down Glebe Lane the other day and, on reaching the northern corner of Glebe Wood, happened to turn round and scan the horizon towards Woolverstone. It was then I realised that what I could see was very close to the original setting of our estate village. The main road is set on a sweeping curve and to my left the buildings of Home Farm were clear and as my eyes moved to the right took in the estate cottages, Berners Hall, the Widows Homes and Village School - almost without interruption from modern buildings. It gave pause for thought. Try it yourself and - just for a moment - step back into the past. A little further down the lane and you will come to two white posts that mark our Roadside Nature Reserve. The rare plant found there is called Orpine. Babergh District Council - New Joint Local Plan 2018 - 2036

The Parish Council is working hard on their response to the new Joint Local Plan consultation document. We will post our response on the website on completion. However, it is also important that there are responses from individuals as well. Not all the questions are relevant to Woolverstone. However, some are:

- Q5. What is most important for your town or village?
- Q12. Do you agree with the proposed joint settlement hierarchy?
- Q13. Where should houses be built in Babergh's district?
- Q19. Should the Councils be prioritising the provisions of any particular types of housing?
- Q26. How should we decide on housing growth in rural areas?
- Q64. What do you consider the key infrastructure issues in your community?
- Q74. Where should Woolverstone's settlement boundary be?
- Q78. Do you consider identified development sites (Glebe Field SS0255 and field behind Berners Hall between Berners Hall and Widows Homes SS0203) to be appropriate for allocation or inclusion within the settlement ?

When you open the "BMSDC Joint Local Plan Consultation Document (Interactive)" you will be asked to register an account. Once this is done you will see the document in a way you can interact with. Click on the pen icon when you wish to write something. Click on the magnifying glass icon when you want to see what has already been written. You do not have to answer all the questions!

All responses to the draft plan must be submitted before 5.00 pm on 10th November!

The Local Plan, when finalised by BDC, will plot development in Woolverstone and on the Peninsula over the next 18 years. We need to make sure we have made a detailed and careful response so our voice and views are clearly heard.
