Dear All

It has been a fantastic few weeks for fungi foraging! The warm earth was made fruitful by some pretty torrential rain. Fields and woods alike were clothed in a variety of mushrooms and toadstools. Some are easy to identify and safe to eat. Beautiful and delicious Parasol Mushrooms were hiding under the chestnut trees on Church Field where the mower couldn't reach them. Pick them young when the cap is the size of a tennis ball with little beige flakes lifting off the surface and before they have time to open into their eponymous shape. Check the stem for the tell-tale signs that flies have beaten you to it and already reached the base; look for holes travelling upwards. Cook them in butter with a little garlic. Tasty! Keep an eye out for the Giant Puff-ball, another easily identified fungus on the Park growing to the size of a football. Slice as thick as steak and fry with butter. They keep their texture well when cooked and are quite solid.

But watch out for those that will not do you any good! There was a wonderful crop of Yellow-staining Mushrooms in the Marina, looking for all the world like edible Horse Mushrooms. But no! Run the edge of your nail across the top and a bright yellow weal will appear. Steer clear!

A final thought: why not get yourself a good guidebook to help you identify friend from foe?

The Highways Reporting Tool can be used to report issues from the list below:

- Blocked drain
- Bridge or highway structure
- Cycle lanes or tracks
- Drain-manhole cover
- Debris, weeds or mud on the road
- Flooding on a road or pavement
- Heavy goods vehicle incident
- Grass cutting
- Lit sign or bollard
- Missing or damaged barriers or guardrails
- Missing or faded road markings
- Obscured, missing or damaged sign
- Pothole
- Pavement defect
- Public right of way
- Street light
- Traffic signal or pedestrian crossing
- Tree or hedge affecting the highway
